VALENTINE SMILE



SOME REMINDERS FOR YOU

The GECAC Union City Senior Center is meant to be our home away from home. That being said we are finding that many of us are not the best at cleaning up after ourselves. Please be courteous enough that if you drop or spill something that you clean it up or ask for help if you are unable to. We have a recycling trash can and many times we find trash in it. Please be mindful that you are discarding you garbage into the correct receptacle.

SNACKS AND BEVERAGES

I would like to remind everyone that we do offer snacks and beverages but they are not free, the center has to purchase these items for you. We ask for a donation of at least 50 cents per item. For those of you that do donate snacks WE APPRECIATE YOU! We accept unopened, individually wrapped snacks any time.

MEDICARE MINUTE...

Did you know? Medicare Part B will cover diagnostic hearing and balance exams if your Medicare enrolled doctor or health care provider orders them to find medical treatment.

You can also see an audiologist once every 12 months without an order from your health care provider, but only for:

- Non-acute hearing conditions (like hearing loss that occurs over many years)
- Diagnostic services related loss that's treated with surgically implanted hearing devices

To find out how much your test, items or service will cost, talk to your doctor or health care provider. The specific amount you'll owe may depend on several things, like:

- Other insurance you may have
- How much your doctor charges
- If your doctor accepts assignment
- The type of facility
- Where you get the test, item or service

Your doctor or other health care provider may recommend you get servies more often than Medicare covers. Or, they may recommend services that Medicare does not cover. If this happens, you may have to pay some or all of the costs. Ask questions so you understand why your doctor is recommending certain servies and if, or how much Medicare will pay for them. Medicare Part B **does not** cover hearing aids or exams for fitting hearing aids.
